

Chairman and officers of ERC Scientific Council announced

The newly-nominated Scientific Council of the future European Research Council (ERC) has announced its Chairman, Prof. Fotis Kafatos, and two Vice-Chairs Prof. Helga Nowotny and Prof. Daniel Estève. They have been elected by their peers, the 22 founding members of the Scientific Council, following a procedure agreed by them at their inaugural meeting on 19 October. This puts the Scientific Council in a position to start exercising its leading role in the development of the European Research Council.

Prof. Kafatos currently holds the Chair of Insect Immunogenomics at Imperial College, London. Born in Greece, he studied Biology in the USA and worked as Professor at Harvard for three decades, before serving two successful terms (1993-2005) as Director-General of the European Molecular Biology Laboratory (EMBL). He also held several leading positions in universities and research establishments in Greece. He is a leading molecular biologist and works on malaria.

Prof. Nowotny is currently Chair of the EURAB (European Research Advisory Board); Fellow at the Wissenschaftszentrum in Vienna and Professor emeritus of Social Studies of Science at ETH Zurich. She has occupied several teaching and research positions in several leading European universities, specialising on the current transformation of the research system.

Prof. Estève is currently Director of the Service de Physique de l'état condensé at CEA Saclay in France. His main fields of research are statistical physics, nuclear magnetic resonance, superconductivity, mesoscopic physics and nanoscience and quantum computing. He has been visiting scientist in research institutes across the world and undertaken collaborations with a number of universities in Europe.

The ERC is an unprecedented initiative designed to boost European excellence in science, technology and the humanities, through the creation of a new, autonomous funding agency to support frontier research, selecting projects on the basis of excellence through pan-European competition. EU Research Ministers recently came to a political agreement to support this initiative, in the next round of funding for the EU research, in the period 2007-2013.

Prof Kafatos said today: *“It is a privilege for us to head the Scientific Council and thereby constitute the presidency of the future ERC. The ERC initiative is vital for European science, and I am delighted that the Research Ministers have given their support. This heralds the realisation of a project which has come about through the concerted effort of committed scientists and scientific organisations, politicians and other stakeholders across Europe over many years. At this juncture we wish to acknowledge the strong commitment to this project by Commissioner Potočnik and Director-General Mitsos. We look forward to the formal co-decision of the Council of Ministers and the European Parliament in the next year.*

The Scientific Council is absolutely committed to an ERC which meets the highest aspirations of scientists and scholars across Europe. We will work intensively to create a suitable organisational framework, with the assistance of an experienced Secretary General whom we intend to appoint, and in concert with an appropriate, flexible and responsive administrative structure, potentially an Executive Agency; we expect to be fully involved in the selection of its Director. Coherent progress in developing both the strategy and the operational methods of the implementation structure will allow the ERC to work in an efficient and integrated way. We are determined to seize this unique opportunity to build a new pan-European organisation

dedicated to research excellence, thereby contributing to both the culture and the competitiveness of Europe.”

The European Commission has proposed a budget of approximately €1.5 bn p.a. The eventual budget will be determined by the outcome of the ongoing discussions on the EU budget.
