ERC at AAAS 2015 Ground-breaking European research presented in the US

12 February 2015

The European Research Council (ERC) crosses the Atlantic to take part in the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) Annual Meeting in San Jose, USA, from today until 16 February. ERC President Prof. Jean-Pierre Bourguignon will participate, along with eight ERC-funded top researchers. The ERC will discuss the need to go beyond the frontiers of knowledge for Europe to stay competitive.

On the eve of the conference, President Bourguignon said: "I am delighted to be back at the AAAS meeting with its inspiring mix of people interested in research in a broad range of fields. This year, the European Research Council is again represented by a number of great scientists who will showcase their research projects, exchange knowledge and testify to the importance of frontier research. The ERC's core mission is to support bright minds like them, by giving them the means and freedom to develop their creative research ideas in Europe."

The AAAS, the world's largest and most influential general scientific society, annually gathers thousands of leading scientists, engineers, educators, policy-makers, and journalists from around the world to discuss recent developments in science and technology. The theme of this year's edition is "Innovations, Information, and Imaging".

The ERC is attending the AAAS Annual Meeting for the eighth consecutive year, and this time will hold three scientific sessions focusing on the future of cancer research, the use of new information technologies in analysing historical data, and the space inspirations in the built environment.

Established by the European Commission

Background

Set up in 2007 by the European Union (EU), the European Research Council (ERC) is the first European funding organisation for excellent frontier research. Every year, it selects and funds the very best, creative researchers of any nationality and age to run five-year projects based in Europe.

The ERC strives to attract top researchers from anywhere in the world to come to Europe. To date, the ERC has funded more than 4,500 top researchers at a variety of stages in their careers and in any field of research.

Under the new EU research and innovation programme, Horizon 2020 (2014-2020), the ERC has a budget of over €13 billion (around \$ 14.7 billion).

The ERC consists of an independent Scientific Council and an Executive Agency. The Scientific Council, the ERC's governing body, is composed of 22 distinguished scientists and scholars. Prof. Jean-Pierre Bourguignon has been the ERC President since 1 January 2014.
